General Conditions

This event is run under the FEI Statutes, 21st edition, effective April 2004, the FEI General-Regulations, 20th edition, revision 2001, the Veterinary-Regulations, 9th edition 2002, the FEI-Rules for Driving Events, 8th edition 2001, the FEI Rules for Worldcup Driving Events, for the season 2004/2005, the FEI Rules for Dressage Events, 21st edition 2003 and Rules for Jumping Events, 21st edition 2003 and all corrections subsequently published by the FEI with its provisions taking precedence.

An arbitration procedure is provided for in the FEI Statutes and General Regulations referred to above. In accordance with this procedure, any appeal against a decision rendered by the FEI or its official bodies is to be settled exclusively by the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) in Lausanne, Switzerland.

The OC acknowledges that § 1.4 LPO (German Show Rules) is binding for international events in Germany.

Specific Technical Conditions

Technical conditions

The event is held in the Hanns-Martin-Schleyer-Hall, Stuttgart. Jumping and driving arena (hall) about 40 x 70 m, sand. Dressage arena 20 x 60 m also in the hall, sand. Two warm up halls about 25 x 50 m and 15 x 30 m, sand. Stables: 3 x 3 m.

Facilities Offered

a) Riders/Grooms

For the invited foreign competitors: Meals for the competitors and the grooms are given in the hall. For the foreign riders voucher for single-rooms are given by the organizer for max. 5 overnight stays. All extras like drinks, telephone etc. are on the competitor's own account. Hotel-reservations which will be made in the hotel "Europe", Stuttgart have to be booked together with the entry.

German riders have to book their rooms themselves or make binding reservations when handing in the entries. On presentation of the hotel invoice the OC will pay 40 € per overnight (maximum of 4 overnight stays) for riders of the classes No. 1 - 14.

Drivers:

The drivers (in competition 15 and 16) will receive free accommodation for themselves and 2 grooms for 3 overnight stays.

b) Horses

Horses are stabled in tents. For jumping and dressage horses a fee of 75 € per box will be levied. First bedding included. Forage has to be brought along or can be purchased on the show grounds at the local prices.

For each horse of German riders which has won less than 500 € the OC will pay reimbursement of transport charges (calculated for the one-way distance):

Level I	from 101 up to 200 km	30 €
Level II	from 201 up to 400 km	50 €
Level III	from 401 up to 600 km	70 €
Level IV	from 601 up to 800 km	90 €
Level V	801 km and more	110 €

For horses of foreign riders level V will apply.

Each driver will receive transport expenses at the rate of 2 € per km one way (maximum 2,000 €)

c) Welcome

The time and date of arrival of riders and horses and their means of transport must be given to the OC to facilitate them on arrival.

d) Shuttle service

The organizer offers a shuttle service from the Schleyer-Hall to the hotel, free of charge.

e) Advertising and Publicity

The competitors are authorised to carry the logo of their personal sponsor in accordance with Art. 136 and 960.4 (driving). The chief steward is responsible for ensuring that FEI Regulations relating to Art. 136 are respected by the competitor before entering the arena. Competitors not complying with Art. 136 will not be permitted into the arena during the competition.

Entries without all necessary details will not be accepted. In case of entry by telephone, immediate confirmation by letter is necessary. Entries for foreign competitors are to be made by their National Federations. If possible, we need the names of the grooms to prepare the accreditation.

Deadline for substitution of riders and/or horses: Wednesday, 17/11/2004

The entries must include the following information on horses: Name, stud book initials/breed and registration number, country of birth, year of birth, sex, colour, FEI-passport number, name(s) of owner(s), name of sire and of dam.

Starting fee including 1 € LK fee (for the regional association of Baden-Württemberg) per reserved starting place and 8,50 € MCP-fee have to be paid at closing time of declaration.

Important: Sites for caravans have to be ordered with the entries.

Customs Formalities

For questions pertaining to the veterinary and animal diseases legislation for horses from abroad and regarding the horses' transportation, the OC is ready to assist. Customs and veterinary fees are not paid by the organizer.

Veterinary Aspects

Veterinary Examinations, Horse Inspections and Passport Controls

These will be carried out in accordance with Vet. Regs. Art. 1011; Rules for Dressage Events Appendix I, Rules for Jumping Events Appendix VII and Rules for Driving Events Art. 910. General Regulations 20th edition, revision 2001 will apply:

Art. 139.1: Every horse entered for any competition at CNs, CSI1*, CDI1/2* in a foreign country, and all horses entered for CSIs2/3/4/5*, CDIs3*, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries, must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by a FEI Recognition Card, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art. 139.2: Horses taking part in CNs, CSI1*, CDI1/2* in their own country are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered, identifiable by diagram. Unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin, all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

The first horse inspection for CSI and CDI is Wednesday 17th November 2004 from 15 - 18 o'clock and Thursday 18th November 2004 from 8 - 11 o'clock, for CAI Thursday 18th November 2004 from 17 - 18 o'clock. Further inspections will be announced.

Equine Influenza Vaccination, Vet. Regs. Appendix VI

All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian who is not the owner of the animal, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given no less than 21 days and no more than 92 days apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 12 months subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables.

The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequently booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling. In many cases booster injections are recommended by the manufacturers and National Veterinary Authorities/Regularity Authorities at intervals more frequent than 12 months.

Sampling for Prohibited Substances (Vet. Regs. Chap. V and VI and Appendix III)

Regular sampling is carried out in CSIs3/4/5*, CDIs3*, CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended.

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only). Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI's Medication Control Program (Groups I and II only).

Medication Control Program

The OC of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge competitors the equivalent of 12,50 CHF (8,50 €) per horse per event as a contribution towards the cost of the MCP Programme.

Health certificates

At the time of the first examination, i.e. on arrival of the horses on the show venue and before entering the stables, every competitor is obliged to have on hand the health certificates which are required for the transport to the event:

- a) if the competitor comes from an EU member country, a health certificate for registered equidae according to the specimen of annex B of directive 90/426 EEC in the current valid issue. (see attached specimen)
- b) if the competitor comes from a third country, a health certificate for registered equidae according to the specimen of annex II of the decision of the Commission 92/260 in the current valid issue.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The competitor must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad. In case the OC has entrusted to a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents. Besides, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

Miscellaneous

Complaints/objections only can be made in writing accompanied by 150 CHF deposit (Art. 168 - 171).

All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money as well as reimbursements (e. g. transport charges, travelling expenses) will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art. 130.2 following the last competition at the latest. Settlement will be done per competitor. Depending on the agreement with the horse owner, each competitor binds himself, to pass on to the horse owners the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money. The organizer is allowed to deduct possibly outstanding debts of the competitor. Acc. to § 50a Abs. 4 this also applies to foreign horse owners. After having deducted the turnover tax from the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money the following income tax will be due: no taxes up to 250 EUR, 10 % up to 500 EUR, 15 % up to 1,000 EUR, 20 % exceeding 1,000 EUR; plus 5,5 % solidarity fee of the income tax. The tax deduction has to be confirmed on demand. Those foreign competitors being exempted from tax deduction are kindly asked to submit an exemption certificate either with the entry or on the first show day at the latest. Every competitor himself is responsible for the correctness of the details he submits.

To the winner of a car which is scheduled for a certain competition no prize-money will be paid out instead.

Entry-badges are only given to the active riders, one accompanying person, one groom per rider and two owners per horse acc. to the FEI passport.

Each driver will be given a maximum of 8 accreditations.

Starting order: Jumping - for all classes the starting order is fixed by the organizer in accordance with Art. 252.2 and Annex VI (draw and rotation) except stated otherwise in the competition. Dressage - the starting order is drawn, except stated otherwise in the competition.

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, competitors, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. He also declines any liability for theft, damages, fire or other incidents.

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Federation Equestre International (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

A. International Jumping Competitions

Horses 6 years or over with

1. Foreign riders whose NF has received an invitation - invitations to NF's will include the number of riders invited to compete.
2. The FEI has the right to nominate 2 riders.
3. In addition to the above-mentioned foreign riders, 15% of all CSI competitors may receive a personal invitation of the organiser (wildcard) through their NF.
4. The German Champion at Balve 2004 (female and male), 3 German Juniors/Young Riders as well as 10 further German riders having been nominated by the federal trainer jumping.
5. In addition 3 German riders holding performance rating S 1 who belong to and who are nominated by the federal association of Baden-Württemberg.
6. Each competitor is allowed to start a maximum of 3 horses. Each horse can start in 2 competitions per day. One groom per rider.
7. The organiser draws up a list of all definitely starting competitors („masterlist“), classified according to the above criteria, which must be given to the German NF office, the Foreign Judge and the NF Delegate. Any alterations may only be done in mutual agreement before the event starts.

Dress and saddlery acc. to Art. 256 and 257.

1. Opening Jumping Competition Qualification for Class No. 7

Dotation: 6.000 € (1.400/1.200/1.000/800/600/400/300/3x100)

Each rider may compete with one horse only.

Obstacles 1,40-1,50 m, Speed 350 m/min.

Scoring Method: table A according to Art. 238.2.1 (penalties and time without jump-off)

Starting fee: 44 €

2. Speed and Handiness Jumping Competition Qualification for Class No. 4 and 5

Dotation: 15.000 € (4.000/3.300/2.600/1.700/1.200/750/500/400/300/250)

Each rider may compete with one horse only.

Obstacles 1,50-1,60 m

Scoring Method: table C according to Art. 239/263 (faults are penalised in seconds, no jump-off)

Starting fee: 54 €

3. Jumping Competition

Dotation: 8.000 € (2.000/1.700/1.300/1.000/700/400/2x250/2x200)

Each rider may compete with one horse only.

Obstacles 1,40-1,50 m, Speed 350 m/min

Scoring Method: table A according to Art. 238.2.1 (penalties and time without jump-off)

Starting fee: 44 €

4. Jumping Competition Qualification for Class No. 5

Dotation: 16.000 € (4.000/3.400/2.800/2.000/1.500/850/500/400/300/250)

Open to a maximum of 30 riders only; in the individual ranking the present Olympic-Champion, World-Champion, Worldcup-Winner, European Champion, German Champion (rating males) and also the best placed riders in competition No. 2 up to a total number of 30 starters. Each rider may compete with one horse only.

Obstacles 1,50-1,60 m, Speed 350 m/min.

Scoring Method: table A according to Art. 238.2.1 (penalties and time without jump-off)

Starting order: in reverse order of merits from competition 2.

Starting fee: 64 €

5. „Mercedes German Master“ Jumping Competition with one Jump-off

Dotation: 1st place a Car Mercedes Benz, from 2nd place on 52.000 € (17.000/12.500/8.500/5.000/3.000/6x1.000). The net value of the car will be printed in the result sheets.

Open to the 12 best placed riders of the competitions No. 2 and 4. Each rider may compete with one horse only that was started in competition No. 2 or No. 4. Point-system: Winner: number of starters in competition 2 plus one point, 2nd place 2 points less than the winner, 3rd place 3 points less than the winner etc.

Obstacles max. 1,60 m, Speed 350 m/min.

Starting order: in reverse order of the point standing from competition 2 and 4 The rider with the most points is the last one to start.

Scoring Method: table A according to Art. 238.2.2 (penalties and time, one jump-off in case of equal penalties for the first place)

Starting fee: 104 €

6. Jumping Competition with one Jump-off

Dotation: 10.000 € (2.600/2.100/1.700/1.300/850/600/500/350)

Open only to riders who didn't start in competition No. 5. Each rider may compete with one horse only.

Obstacles 1,45-1,55 m, speed 350 m/min..

Scoring Method: table A according to Art. 238.2.2 (penalties and time, one jump-off in case of equal penalties for the first place)

Starting fee: 44 €

7. „Smart-Cup“ Knock-out Jumping Competition

Dotation: 1st place a car Smart, from 2nd place on 10.000 € (3.000/2x1.500/4x600/8x200). The net value of the car will be printed in the result sheets.

Only riders who have completed the first round will be placed. Open to the 16 best riders in class No. 1. If a qualified rider retires the next rider is allowed to start. Each rider may compete with one horse only.

Obstacles 1,40-1,50 m

Scoring Method: table A according to Art. 272.6, starting-order according to Appendix V, FEI Rules for Jumping Events

Starting fee: 44 €

8. Ladies German Master Jumping Competition with two rounds

Dotation: 15.000 € (5.000/3.500/2.500/1.500/1.000/500/4x250)

Open to 10 lady riders. 3 German lady riders who in agreement with the organiser are nominated by the federal trainer jumping and 6 foreign lady riders who have been entered by their home NF as well as one lady rider who receives a wild card from the organizer. Should there be more foreign lady riders in the event than starting places are available, their current ranking on the FEI/Gandini World Jumping Rankings will decide on their participation. Each lady rider may compete with one horse only.

Obstacles 1,50-1,60 m, Speed 350 m/min.

Scoring Method: table A according to Art. 273/3.3 (two identical rounds, in the 1st round penalties with a time allowed, in the second round penalties and time, no jump-off. All riders except those eliminated or retiring return to the 2nd round. For the 2nd round the starting order is in reverse order of the result in the first round)

Starting fee: 54 €

9. Accumulator Jumping Competition with 2 Jokers

Dotation: 16.000 € (4.000/3.400/2.800/2.000/1.500/850/500/400/300/250)

Each rider may compete with one horse only.

Obstacles 1,50-1,60 m, Speed 350 m/min.

Scoring Method: according to Art. 269/1,2,5 (after the finishing line each rider must jump one of the two alternative obstacles, the first joker counts twice points of the last obstacle, the second joker counts half points of the last obstacle. No jump-off)

Starting fee: 64 €

10. „Mercedes-Benz, Landesbank Baden-Württemberg, Allianz with Grand Prix of Stuttgart“ Jumping Competition with 2 rounds and jump-off

Dotation: 1st place a car Mercedes Benz, from 2nd place on 67.000 € (20.000/15.000/10.000/7.000/4.000/3.000/2.000/8x750). The net value of the car will be printed in the result sheets.

The owner of the winning horse is invited to take part in the prize giving ceremony.

One horse per rider.

Open to the competitors of class No. 5 and up to a total number of 35, the best of the classes No. 2, 4, and 9. Point-system: Winner: number of starters in class No. 2 plus 1 point, 2nd place 2 points less than the winner, 3rd place 3 points less than the winner etc. Only competitors who at least reach their 18th birthday in 2004.

Obstacles max. 1,60 m, Speed 350 m/min.

Judgement: A acc. to Art. 273.3.1 and 2.2. In the 1st round: Penalties under table A against the clock. In the 2nd altered round: Penalties under table A not against the clock with a time allowed. In the 2nd round only the 16 best combinations (rider/horses) incl. those who tie for the 16th place, respectively all combinations (rider/horses) with a clear round are admitted.

Jump-off in case of equality of penalties for the first place after two rounds.

Starting order: 1st round: by draw, 2nd in reverse order of merits of the 1st round.

Starting fee: 104 €

B. International dressage competitions

Horses 7 years or over with

1. foreign riders whose NF has received an invitation (e. g. DEN, ESP, FRA, NED, RUS, SUI, SWE, USA; reserve AUT, BEL, GBR, ITA) - each with a minimum of 2 riders. The NFs decide which riders to send.
2. up to 10 German riders having been nominated by the federal trainer dressage.
3. up to 2 German riders having been nominated in agreement with the OC by the federal trainer dressage.
4. up to 2 German riders holding performance rating D 1 who belong to and haven been nominated by the federal association of Baden-Württemberg.
5. Each competitor is allowed to start a maximum of 2 horses. One groom per rider.
6. Each horse may only start in competitions No. 11, 12 (Art. 422.3.4/422.3.6 und 422.6) or in competitions No. 13, 14 (Art. 422.3.4/422.3.5 und 422.6)
7. The organiser draws up a list of all definitely starting competitors („masterlist“), classified according to the above criteria, which must be given to the German NF office, the Foreign Judge and the NF Delegate. Any alterations may only be done in mutual agreement before the event starts.

Dress and saddlery acc. to Art. 427 and 428. Classification acc. to Art. 430 - 434,

11. „Duchesse Diane-Prize“ Dressage Competition „Grand Prix“ Qualification for Class No. 12

Dotation: 8.000 € (2.000/1.600/1.300/1.000/800/600/400/300)

Participation according to Art. 422.3.4 and 6. Each rider may compete with one horse only.

FEI-test "Grand Prix B" (2003) to be ridden from memory.

Starting order: by draw in groups of 5; reverse order of World Ranking list (the group of the 5 best riders acc. to the World Ranking list valid at the event has to start last).

Starting fee: 44 €

12. „Duke Carl-Prize“ Free Style Test (FEI GP-Level) - Dressage Competition

Dotation: 21.000 € (5.000/4.300/3.400/2.600/1.800/1.300/900/700/2x500)

Open to the 10 best participants in competition No. 11. If a qualified rider retires, the next one moves up.

Participation according to Art. 422.3.6 and 6.

The FEI-GP-level-test 1999 "Freestyle", to be ridden to music.

Tape or disc (two copies) has to be delivered with start-declaration.

The rider is allowed to ride with the reins in one hand (Art. 418.3).

Starting-order: The riders placed 6th to 10th in class No. 11 will start first, followed by the group of riders placed 1st to 5th. The order of starting within these groups is determined by draw acc. to Art. 425.

Starting fee: 64 €

Special Rating Dressage Trophy of the House Württemberg

Prizes of honour to the riders placed 1st - 3rd in a special rating of the classes No. 11 and 12. Points according to the placing: 30, 27, 25, 23, 21, 19, 17, 15, 13, 11. The prizes will be awarded during the prize giving for competition No. 12.

13. Dressage Competition „Grand Prix“ Qualification for Class No. 14

Dotation: 8.000 € (2.000/1.600/1.300/1.000/800/600/400/300)

Participation according to Art. 422.3.4 and 6. Each rider may compete with one horse only.

FEI-test "Grand Prix B" (2003) to be ridden from memory.

Starting order: by draw in groups of 5; reverse order of World Ranking list (the group of the 5 best riders acc. to the World Ranking list valid at the event has to start last).

Starting fee: 44 €

14. „Kampmann German Master“ Dressage Competition „Grand Prix Special“ Qualification for the Kampmann-Cup 2004/2005

Dotation: 30.000 € (7.200/6.100/4.700/3.700/2.800/1.800/1.000/700/4x500)

Open to and compulsory for the 12 best competitors (including those who tie for the 12th place) in class No. 13. Participation according to Art. 422.3.5 and 6.

Starting-order: The rider placed 9th to 12th in class No. 13 will start first, followed by the group of riders placed 5th to 8th and then the group of riders placed 1st to 4th. The order of starting within these groups is determined by draw.

FEI-test "Grand Prix Special" (2003) to be ridden from memory.

Starting fee: 74 €

C. International driving competitions - Four in hand

Open to 5 drivers of the Top Ten Drivers 2004, 1 driver from overseas as well as one driver from the home nation with wild card jointly allocated acc. to WC rules driving by the German NF and the organizer; this wild card may not be given to any of the 10 qualified World Cup drivers. A further wild card may be allocated to 1 home driver, jointly selected by the NF and the respective OC. Each driver may enter 5 horses.

**16. „Schenker German Master“ with two rounds
Time obstacles competition (World Cup Qualifier)**

Dotation: 20.000 € (6.500/4.400/3.200/2.300/1.600/2x1.000)
Equipment acc. to Art. 947 (marathon harness)
First round: open to the same teams as in competition No. 15. Same course as No. 15. Second shortened round: Only the top three drivers from the first round may compete in the second round.
Starting order 1st round according to the reverse order of the result in competition No. 15; starting order 2nd round in reverse order of the result (acc. to Art. 967) in the first round.
Starting fee: 64 €

The indoor course consists of obstacles according to Art. 962 and 949.

- 2 marathon type obstacles (maximum 5 gates each)
- 1 bridge
- approximately 10 cone-type obstacles

Both rounds are run as time competitions (Art. 967) with penalties converted to seconds. The scale of penalties is as follows:

- Dislodging one or two balls in the same single obstacle	5
- Knocking over or down any element of a multiple obstacle	5
- Causing an obstacle to be rebuilt (clock stops)	5
- Each groom or driver dismounting 1st or 2nd time (clock does not stop)	5

- Wrong course in a multiple obstacle, corrected	5
- First or second disobedience	no penalties

Eliminations:

- Groom(s) or driver dismounting 3rd time	elimination
- Third disobedience	elimination
- Wrong course single obstacle (sequence or direction)	elimination
- Wrong course in a multiple obstacle, not corrected	elimination
- Failing to pass through the starting or finishing flags	elimination
- Carriage turnover	elimination
- Active use of the whip by the groom	elimination

After ringing the bell the driver has 45 seconds to start his course. If he has not started, the clock starts to run.

For the placing in the World Cup competition, the times of both rounds are added for the top 3 drivers, for the other drivers the time in the first round decides.
